This month we are focusing on Japan, where missionaries first landed in 1568. Unfortunately, the percentage of Japanese believers today is still very small. Let's pray that the work begun by these first missionaries in the 16th century flourishes again across all of Japan.



Japan is made up of over 6,500 islands. All fall within the Ring of Fire in the Pacific Ocean, which makes the country experience frequent earthquakes and volcanic eruptions. This location also explains its diverse terrain-its majestic mountains and extensive forest areas. Japan is a land of stunning landscapes set against densely populated cities.

Did you know?

- ▶ Picture yourself walking into a Japanese inn that was started in 705 AD. It's been owned by 52 generations of the same family. Nishiyama Onsen Keiunkan is the oldest hotel in the world according to Guinness World Records.
- ▶ Japan's life expectancy ranks third in the world behind Hong Kong and Macao. The life expectancy of the average Japanese person is 85 years old.
- ▶ Baseball is the number one sport in eight countries including Japan.
- ▶ Japan has more vending machines than any other country, roughly 1 for every 23 people. Unique technology allows one vending machine to serve cans of both hot and cold coffee. You can even buy perishable items like lettuce, fruit or free-range eggs from a vending machine.
- ► Can you imagine living on a small island where there are more cats than there are people? Tashirojima, a small island off the coast of Japan, has four times more cats than people.







Praying for Japan

As of May 2024, Japan's Steel Dragon is the longest roller coaster in the world at 8,133 feet. Would you ride it? I wouldn't. Maybe getting stuck on one for hours as a teenager left a lasting impression. The rest of my family loves roller coasters: the anticipation, the thrill, the speed-sometimes the unknown—creates a fun experience for them.

Real life ups and downs, twists and turns or the unknown can create stress, fear or anxiety in our lives. Is what's happening in your life causing you to feel out of control?

I find that focusing on the Lord, especially by thinking about how awesome He is (praise), or taking time to list the many things I'm thankful for, can help me break through my swirling emotions. Consider being old fashioned and write these verses on notecards, or simply on the note app in your phone so you can pull them out when your life starts to twist and turn. As you stop to praise Him and thank Him, let the presence of God bring you peace.

Week 1 Requests



□ Day 1	Many Japanese people would prefer to accept Jesus as another great teacher among many that they admire. For many Japanese, the claim that Jesus is the one true living God is offensive. Pray that Japanese people who hold a universalistic perspective would be open to seeing Jesus as the way, the truth and the life.
□ Day 2	Most of the pastors in Japan are over the age of 60. And there are more pastors active in the church in Japan who are over 80 years old than there are under 30. As leadership in the Japanese church is growing older, pray for the next generation of leaders to take the baton and lead well.
□ Day 3	Pray for people in Japan who are struggling with suicidal thoughts and thoughts about death. Pray that they're able to tell someone in their life about how they're feeling. Pray that they will find hope in Jesus.
□ Day 4	Many Japanese young people suffer from crushing depression. Shame over poor school performance or feeling isolated can leave them feeling hopeless about the future. Pray that they will find their security and hope in God.
□ Day 5	The two main religions in Japan are Buddhism and Shinto. Buddhists follow the teachings of Buddha and Bodhisattvas, or enlightened ones. Shintoists worship supernatural entities believed to be in all things. Pray that many Japanese people will realize that God is the one true God who provides what we need: His love and redemption. Pray for the Holy Spirit to reveal the only One worth following—Jesus Christ, His son, who has power and authority over all heaven and earth.
□ Day 6	Pray for Japanese people to be drawn to the Lord in the midst of the challenges they face. May they discover the beautiful promise of Jesus in Matthew 11:28-30: "Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and my burden is light" (NIV).
□ Day 7	Pray for Japanese people to find authentic friendships with Christians that lead to changed lives.



Week 2 Requests



□ Day 8	Pray for wisdom and cooperation among Christian workers who are updating a film about the life of Jesus into modern Japanese, so that it is more easily understood by Japanese people who have never learned about Jesus before.
□ Day 9	Pray for harmony within Japanese families—for strong relationships between spouses, parents and children. May God remove any unhealthy conflict and fill their homes with peace that only comes from surrendering to the Lord.
□ Day 10	Manga is a very popular form of literature and art in Japan. Pray for the development of manga gospel resources and the Christians who are creating it. Pray for Japanese people who are reading Christian manga—that it would plant the seed of the message of the gospel in their hearts.
□ Day 11	Pray for the creation of Jesus-centered content for social media. Pray that it will capture the interest of those seeking the truth about God and will draw them to the One true God.
□ Day 12	Record inflation rates in Japan continue to affect women, especially single mothers. The suicide rate, which was steadily decreasing in the past, has increased for all ages and especially among women. Pray for churches, government and communities to come up with ways to locate needy families and provide support to them.
□ Day 13	Pray the following verse for every Christian in Japan. "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." — Philippians 4:6-7, NIV
□ Day 14	Pray for Japanese students who are studying in other countries to have an opportunity to hear the gospel and respond to it.



Week 3 Requests



□ Day 15	Pray for immigrants living in Japan who sometimes face racism and discrimination. Pray for many in Japan to view all people with dignity and as made in the image of God.
□ Day 16	Pray for men in Japan who work away from home and are apart from their families for long periods of time. This can be challenging for marriages and families and can lead to disconnection and affairs. Pray for families to be rooted and united in Christ.
□ Day 17	Kodawari—the pursuit of perfection—is ingrained in Japanese people from a very young age. Pray for people in Japan to understand that they will never be perfect and that only Jesus is perfect and is the source for their salvation.
□ Day 18	In Japan, Christianity is mostly perceived as a Western religion. Pray for the message of the gospel, not religion or an idea of Christianity, to take root in Japanese culture.
□ Day 19	Pray for Japanese students who are often under great pressure to be successful in their future careers. For some it can lead to depression and the tendency to overwork to the detriment of their health. Pray that these students and young adults will develop the healthy living lifestyle that God intended for them, so that they can fully live out their passions, gifts and talents.
□ Day 20	Taking time to thank God is an important part of prayer for all of us. We show God how grateful we are when we spend time telling Him what we are thankful for. Let's pray for Christians in Japan to be thankful to God as the following verse describes. "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever You are my
	God, and I will praise You; You are my God, and I will exalt You. Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; his love endures forever." — Psalm 118:1, 28-29, NIV
□ Day 21	Ask the Lord to unify ministries and churches to better further His Kingdom. Pray that they grow to trust and pursue peace with one another.



Week 4 Requests



□ Day 22	Pray for Japanese Christians to build a stronger connection with God and fellowship with one another, even when they are busy or life is difficult, so that they can serve the Lord as one body.
□ Day 23	Pray for God's Spirit to bring unity to the 120 different Christian denominations in Japan, and to demolish barriers that can divide believers.
□ Day 24	Japanese people love playing and watching sports, so many churches have found sports to be a useful way to reach out to their communities. Pray for people to join sporting events hosted by churches, and pray for the gospel to be shared at these events.
□ Day 25	Many Japanese do not approve of people who become followers of Jesus (follow Christianity) because it is different from what everyone else believes. Social harmony and group cohesion are very important in Japanese society. Pray that God's Spirit provides comfort and peace to those who face rejection or disapproval from their families and communities.
□ Day 26	Pray for young people in Japan who identify as <i>hikikomori</i> . This Japanese word describes a condition that mainly affects young adults who live isolated from the world, cloistered within their parents' homes, and locked in their bedrooms for days, months, or even years on end. Hikikomori refuse to communicate even with their family. Pray that they find and embrace Christian community and the purpose that a life in Christ can bring.
□ Day 27	Pray that Christian gatherings in Japan would follow Paul's instructions from this Bible verse: "Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts" (Colossians 3:16, NIV).
□ Day 28	Pray for the middle-aged population in Japan. Many are facing struggles as they try to care for their aging parents and their children.

Week 5 Requests



- Day 29 Many Japanese young people feel like they are drifting in life, with no real purpose. Pray they turn to Jesus, see how much He values them and find themselves in His purposes.
- Pray for Christian leaders to have wisdom about bringing new ministry workers into Japan. May God help them determine what is possible and what is needed to reach Japanese people with the gospel.
- Day 31 Lord Jesus, we thank You for giving us a chance to pray for Japan each day this month. We believe You will continue Your work there until everyone has heard clearly about Jesus and been invited to follow Him. Someday we'll see how You answered our prayers. May heaven be filled with Japanese who started to follow Jesus in part due to our prayers this month. We give You all honor and praise.
